In the spirit of our core beliefs about ethical gaming, if casino security staff see unattended children, they will follow appropriate protocol and try to locate a parent.

Be aware that casino staff can and will contact the New Mexico Children, Youth and Families Department or local law enforcement in instances of neglect. If your child goes missing in a casino, contact casino security staff immediately.

Please be responsible and join us in our efforts to promote safety in our casinos.





YOU MUST BE OF LEGAL AGE TO GAMBLE

The casinos across the state of New Mexico that have committed to promoting responsible gaming are dedicated to the task of providing a safe environment for all guests.

Just as in any other public place, it is essential that parents or guardians be responsible for their children and share in the Association's mission to make sure that no child be left unattended at any time.



The Responsible Gaming Association of New Mexico is committed to increasing awareness about this issue and educating the patrons of New Mexico's casinos about their responsibility to help create a safe and healthy gaming environment.

Some of our member casinos provide family entertainment options such as bowling, restaurants, and concerts, which also provide social activities for guests not old enough to gamble. Our Association encourages parents to use proper supervision of their children as part of responsible gaming, whenever they are visiting our establishments.

Any time a child is left unattended in a public place, there are potential risks. Patrons of New Mexico's casinos are encouraged to avoid these risks by supervising their children at all times. Casinos dedicated to the mission of the **RGANM** actively promote appropriate response and are involved in developing best practices to ensure the safety of children in casinos across New Mexico. RGANM member casinos also strive to prevent underage gambling.

The casinos of the RGANM follow New Mexico state law, which prohibits any person under legal age from gambling or loitering on the casino floor.

Our casinos diligently work to prevent underage individuals from participating in the games offered at our casinos and place a high priority on best practices to intervene with problem gambling.

The RGANM, as well as each property's security staff, do everything we can to keep minors safe in member casinos across New Mexico, but parents have the ultimate responsibility to keep their children protected.

We care about our guests and are invested in responsible gaming practices. RGANM casino staffs are advised to alert the proper authorities if they perceive neglect of children at one of our casinos.
